Past Continuous

The Past Continuous tells us about something that was happening in the past.

+ To make the Past Continuous, you have to add the past of "to be" (was/were) + verb + ing:

I was playing tennis when it started raining.

He was eating his lunch while listening to music.

I was wondering if you were interested.

They were watching television instead of doing their homework.

If the sentence is <u>negative</u>, then you just have to add "not" after the form of "to be":

I <u>wasn't playing</u> tennis when it started raining. He <u>wasn't eating</u> his lunch while listening to music.

? To ask a question in the Past Continuous, you have to change the order of the words: "to be" + subject + verb + -ing:

Were you playing tennis when it started raining?
Was he eating his lunch while listening to music?
Were they watching television instead of doing their homework?
