## Past Simple

The Past Simple tells us about something that happened in the past, and very often the time is important:

I played tennis yesterday.

+ To make the Past Simple, you have to add –ed for a regular verb:

Play -> Played

However, for irregular verbs, you have to learn their past simple form:

Go -> Went
Eat -> Ate
Be -> Was / Were
Have -> Had
Write -> Wrote
Do -> Did

There are some key words that tell you that you have to use the Past Simple. These include:

Yesterday, last week, ago, recently ... anything to do with TIME

If the sentence is <u>negative</u>, then you often have to add the verb "do" + "not". Look at what happens:

I didn't play tennis yesterday

He didn't help like he promised to do

Exceptions: could, would, should (e.g.He couldn't help her because he was too busy)

The verb "play" doesn't change, but "do" becomes "did"!

? To ask a question in the Past Simple, you use did + verb:

<u>Did</u> he <u>go</u> to the cinema? <u>Did</u> she <u>have</u> her phone when her bag was stolen? Exceptions: could, would, should (e.g. Could he help her?)
